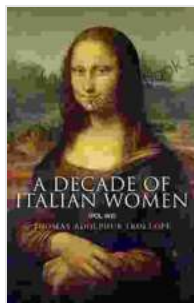

Education

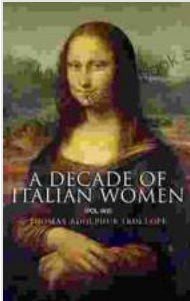

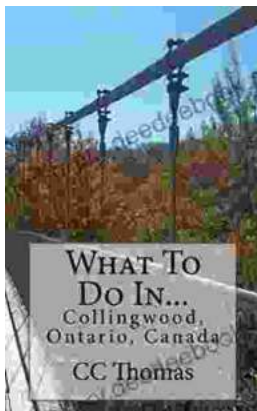

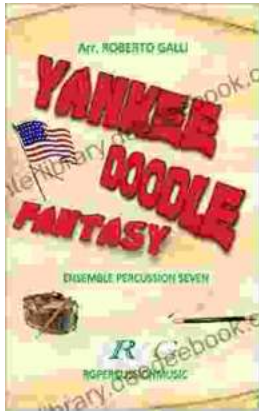
