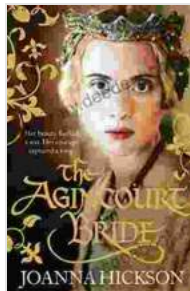


# Joanna Hickson: The Agincourt Bride Who Embodied the Spirit of Medieval England
