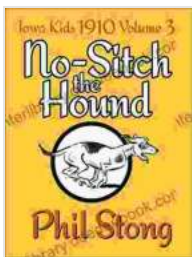


No Sitch the Hound: A Beloved Mascot of the Iowa Hawkeyes

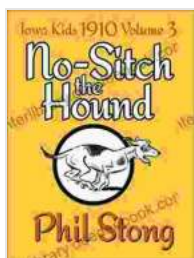
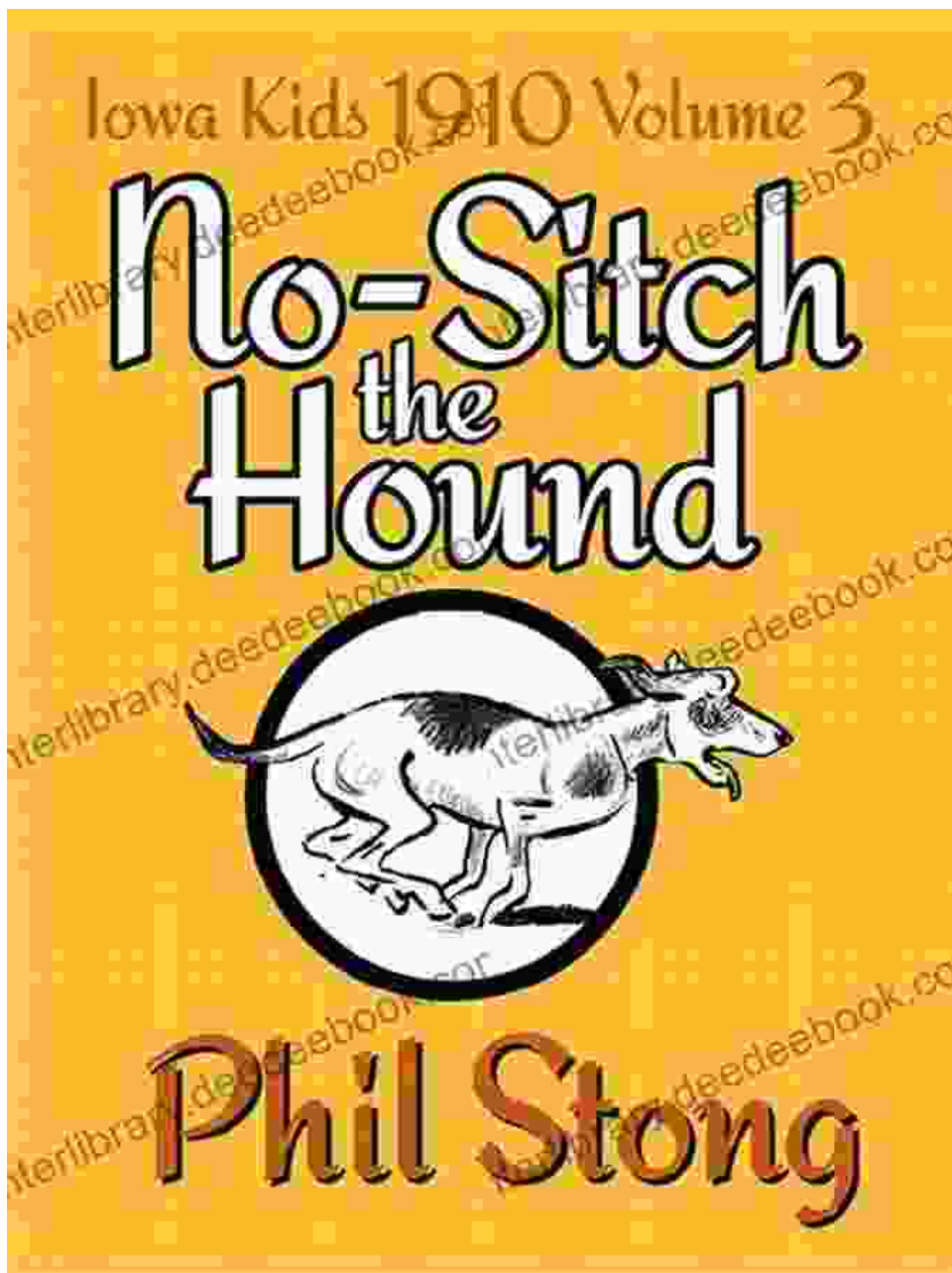
Retirement and Death

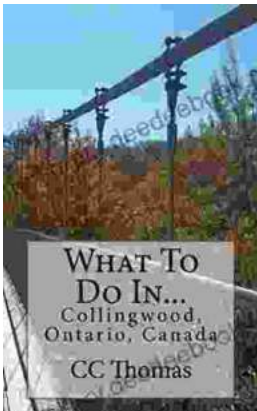

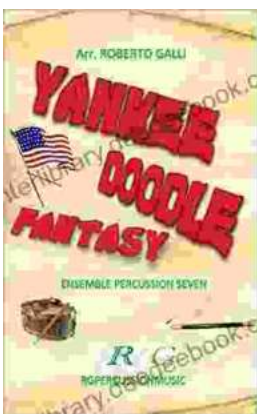
